

## Ruberl Carr

June 1, 1936 – March 26, 2019

Ruberl Carr was born in Tylertown June 1, 1936, the first-born of Percy and Martha Carr. He graduated from Hope Vocational High School, Jayess, in 1956. After high school graduation he moved to Chicago, IL, where he was employed by the National Superior Fur Co. until drafted into the U.S. Army. His career in residential real estate brokerage spans 36 years with licensure in the states of North Carolina, Pennsylvania and Illinois. He died March 26, 2019.

While enrolled at Cortez W. Peters Business College in Chicago, IL, he met Carrie D. Turner. They were married on Aug. 6, 1960, in a military wedding ceremony at the base chapel at Aberdeen Proving Grounds, MD, the military base where he was stationed. To this union a son and daughter were born.

He was drafted into the U.S. Army in January 1959 and served a two-year tour of duty. After an honorable discharge in January 1961, he had a mandate to join the U.S. Army Reserves. His reserve unit was activated Oct. 1,

1961, and deployed to Ft. McLellan, AL. During this unit activation and deployment, he decided to go Regular Army (RA).

As a career soldier, he rose up through the ranks, promoted to, held and retired at the rank of Sergeant Major (SGM), the highest enlisted rank. His overseas duty assignments included Korea, Ethiopia, Vietnam and Germany. Among his awards and decorations are the Armed Forces Expedition Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Bronze Star, National Defense Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Good Conduct with 8 Oak Leaf Clusters, Overseas Service Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, and Joint Forces Commendation. He was a 43-year member of The American Legion.

Survivors are his wife of 58 years, Carrie Carr, of Hanover Park, IL; son David E. Carr and daughter, Aretha L. Carr; granddaughter Anna E. Carr; sister Lula Lee Shields; sister Mary Ruth Fortenberry; sister Sandra Carr-Bensen.

Preceding him in death are his father Percy Sr, mother Martha, and brothers Charlie Sr and Percy Jr., and sister Hattie Lee Gutter.

Carr accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized in 1953. Upon moving to Chicago, he regularly attended Wayman African Methodist Episcopal Church and joined Greater Bethesda Missionary Church. In 1995 he and his wife relocated from Pennsylvania back to Illinois and settled in Hanover Park. He joined Second Baptist Church of Wheaton, IL, where he was ordained to serve in the office of deacon in 2003. Later he joined Second Baptist Church of Elgin, IL where he served on the Veterans Ministry and ordained to serve in the office of deacon in 2006. He served in this role until his death.
