Tylertown Grove No. 74, Woodmen Circle, met in the home of Mrs. W.D. Tynes..

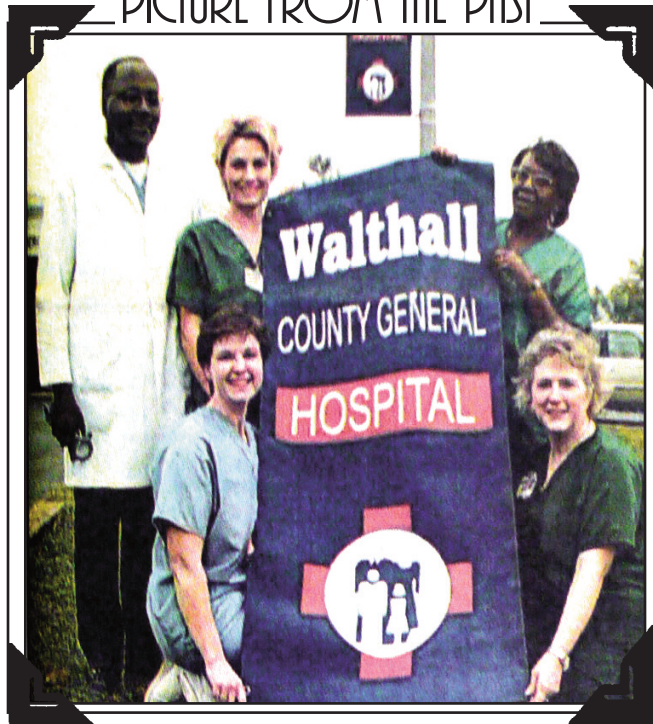
90 years ago...
